# **Method Statement**

Noah's Ark Zoo Farm offers a variety of outreach visits to schools, community groups and care homes where animals can be met and ins some cases handled. Staff also bring a variety of activity resources and bio-artefacts. All animals are in secure transport containers and artefacts and resources are carefully selected dependent on the age and ability of the group. Some animals and artefacts can be touched and handled under staff supervision.

Residual risk to be calculated after all reasonably practicable control measures have been implemented. Residual risk score –Likelihood (L) x Severity (S) =Residual Risk (RR). See matrix on front page.
